Mandombe is an African script used mainly in the Democratic Republic of the Congo for African languages including Lingala, Kikongo ya leta, and Swahili. It was created in 1978 by Wabeladio Payi, and is now used by up to 10,000 people. The script is an syllabary, meaning that it is made up of syllabic units, each representing a consonant and a vowel, such as "ba" or "zu."
